	Hoots Mon!	2:16	Lord Rockingham's XI	No. 1 hit on the UK Singles Chart in 1958. Led by Harry Robinson, born in Elgin, Morayshire, Scotland
	Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	I'm Free	3:51	The Soup Dragons	Named after a character in the 1970s children's television show Clangers, best known for this cover of a Rolling Stones' song. Formed in Bellshill, a town near Glasgow, in 1985.
	Young at Heart	3:24	Bluebells	1984, co-written by guitarist and founder member Bobby Bluebell (real name Robert Hodgens) with Siobhan Fahey of Bananarama
	Movin' On Up	3:51	Primal Scream	1991, from 3rd album Screamadelica. The band formed in 1982 in Glasgow. Guitarist Robert "Throb" Young died just a couple of weeks ago.
	Find My Love	3:45	Fairground Attraction	From 1987 album The First of a Million Kisses. Eddi Reader was born in Glasgow, the daughter of a welder, and the eldest of seven children (her brother, Francis, is vocalist with the band The Trash Can Sinatras)
	Circling The Circumference	2:41	The Trash Can Sinatras	Formed in Irvine, Scotland in 1986. From 1990 album Cake.
	Step Into My Office, Baby	4:14	Belle and Sebastian	Formed in Glasgow in January 1996. Named after a 1965 children's book by French writer Cécile Aubry. From 6th album, Dear Catastrophe Waitress - 2003! Their first single for Rough Trade Records and was produced by Trevor Horn.
	Stuck in the Middle with You	3:24	Stealers Wheel	1972. Written by Gerry Rafferty and Joe Egan. Used in Quentin Tarantino's debut film Reservoir Dogs. Formed in Paisley, Renfrewshire in 1972.
	The Boat That I Row	2:48	Lulu	Born Marie McDonald McLaughlin Lawrie, in Glasgow 1948. This from 1967, written by Neil Diamond.
	Donald Where's Your Troosers?	3:17	Andy Stewart	Stewart wrote the song in 10 minutes while he sat, trouserless, in the lavatory of a recording studio in 1960. He was born in Glasgow, Scotland in 1933.
	Fisherman's Blues	4:23	Waterboys	From 1988 album of the same name. Founding member and only permanent member Mike Scott is from Edinburgh.
	Don't Talk To Me About Love	3:47	Altered Images	1983. Led by lead singer Clare Grogan, born 1962 in Glasgow.
	I Can't Help Myself	3:29	Orange Juice	Founded in the middle class Glasgow suburb of Bearsden as the Nu-Sonics in 1976 (named after a cheap brand of guitar). This from 1982.
	Tinseltown in the Rain	5:54	The Blue Nile	Paul Buchanan and his childhood friend Robert Bell grew up together in Glasgow and both attended the University of Glasgow in the late 1970s. From album A Walk Across the Rooftops, 1984
	Pillar to Post	3:58	Aztec Camera	On Postcard Records label, same as Orange Juice. Formed by Roddy Frame, from East Kilbride. From debut album, High Land, Hard Rain, 1983.
	Sparky's Dream	3:16	Teenage Fanclub	Formed in Bellshill in 1989. From Grand Prix, their fifth album, released in May 1995 on Creation Records.
	This Flight Tonight	3:24	Nazareth	Written by Joni Mitchell, from her 1971 album Blue. This from 1973. Nazareth formed in December 1968 in Dunfermline.
	Sweet Dreams [Are Made Of This]	3:35	Eurythmics	Title track of their 1983 album Sweet Dreams (Are Made of This), the song which provided the group with their breakthrough into commercial success. Annie Lennox, from Aberdeen.
	Party Fears Two	4:06	The Associates	1982, featuring the unique voice of singer Billy Mackenzie, committed suicide 17 years ago. From 1982's Sulk, their second studio album. Formed with keyboardist/guitarist Alan Rankine in Dundee in late 1970s.
	I Travel	4:05	Simple Minds	Johnny & The Self-Abusers, founded on the South Side of Glasgow in 1977. Totally unique sound. Krautrock on speed. 1980, Empires and Dance
	Perfect Skin	3:10	Lloyd Cole And The Commotions	1984, from Rattlesnakes, their debut album. Formed in Glasgow, Scotland in 1982 - but Cole was born in Derbyshire.
	Lloyd, I'm Ready To Be Heartbroken	3:50	Camera Obscura	Formed in Glasgow in 1996. Recorded their third album, Let's Get Out of This Country, in Sweden during 2005.
	Into The Valley	3:11	Skids	Written by Richard Jobson and Stuart Adamson, taken off their 1979 Scared to Dance album.
	Amazing Grace	3:13	Royal Scots Dragoon Guards	A cavalry regiment of the British Army, and the senior Scottish regiment. It was formed on 2 July 1971 at Holyrood, Edinburgh. This recording was originally released in 1972 to mark the amalgamation of the Royal Scots Greys and the 3rd Carabiniers.
