	Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	You Ruined My Blue Suede Shoes	2:36	Roy Hall	Blue Suede Shoes written and first recorded by Carl Perkins in 1955. Roy, born in Virginia, co-wrote Whole Lotta Shakin' Goin' On in 1954.
	Shoppin' For Clothes	2:59	The Coasters	1960. The first song Leiber and Stoller made for The Coasters after their falling out with Elvis' manager.
	Hi-Heel Sneakers	2:50	Tommy Tucker	Over 1000 artists have recorded "Hi-Heel Sneakers". These include the Beatles, the Rolling Stones, the Faces, Sting, Led Zeppelin, Carl Perkins and Elvis Presley. This is the original from 1963
	Hot Pants	3:11	James Brown	Sampled by Eric B. & Rakim on the track Paid in Full. The lyrics are an ode to the captivating power of the title garment, which members of the band first saw on their 1970 European tour.
	Soulful Dress	2:50	Sugar Pie DeSanto	Johnny Otis called her 'Sugar Pie' because she was so tiny
	Fashion	4:48	David Bowie	Second single from 1980 album Scary Monsters (and Super Creeps).
	Baggy Trousers	2:46	Madness	From their 1980 album Absolutely. Written by lead singer Graham "Suggs" McPherson and guitarist Chris Foreman.
	Favourite Shirts (Boy Meets Girl)	3:06	Haircut 100	From debut album Pelican West, 1982.
	Zoot Suit	1:58	The Who	1964, the first single of the Who, who recorded it under the name the High Numbers in an attempt to appeal to a mod audience.
	Long Cool Woman (In A Black Dress)	3:16	The Hollies	Co-writer Allan Clarke was only member left from original 60s lineup. On this 1972 release he imitated John Fogerty's vocal style, and was based on the Creedence song "Green River".
	These boots are made for walkin'	2:43	Nancy Sinatra	1966. Nancy Sinatra was encouraged by the song's writer, Lee Hazlewood, to sing the song as if she were "a sixteen-year-old girl who f**** truck drivers."
	All Around My Hat	4:09	Steeleye Span	1975. Dates from 1820s, a street seller vowed to be true to his fiancée, who had been sentenced to seven years' transportation to Australia for theft, by wearing green willow sprigs in his hatband for "a twelve-month and a day," a symbol of mourning.
	Dedicated Follower Of Fashion	3:01	The Kinks	1966, it lampoons the contemporary British fashion scene and mod culture in general
	Wheres Me Shirt?	3:30	Ken Dodd and The Diddymen	1965. Born on 8 November 1927 in Knotty Ash, Liverpool
	Sharp Dressed Man	4:15	ZZ Top	From their 1983 album Eliminator, and was one of the first ZZ Top songs to use synthesizers.
	Raspberry Beret	3:54	Hindu Love Gods	Hindu Love Gods - their only album, released in 1990. Bill Berry, Peter Dinklage, and Mike Mills of R.E.M. with Warren Zevon. Reputedly made during a late night drunken recording session
	Sweet Gene Vincent	3:33	Ian Dury & The Blockheads	1976, from his first solo album New Boots and Panties!! Ian Dury was a fan of Gene Vincent since his early teens and claims to have bought every single Vincent produced.
	My Favourite Dress	4:15	The Wedding Present	1987, from George Best, their debut album. Led by vocalist and guitarist David Gedge, the band's only constant member.
	Hand in Glove	3:26	The Smiths	Released as their first single in May 1983 on Rough Trade. Peaked at number three on the UK Indie Chart but did not chart (top 75) on the UK singles chart - made 124
	(The Angels Wanna Wear My) Red Shoes	2:50	Elvis Costello	From his debut album, My aim is True, 1977.
	In These Shoes?	3:38	Kirsty MacColl	She died in 2000, was the daughter of songwriter Ewan MacColl. From Tropical Brainstorm, her final album, released in 2000. It was inspired by her trips to Cuba.
	Barefootin'	2:35	Robert Parker	1965.
