Get Outa Me Ouse	3:04	Hustler	Fade out last 10 secs From their first album in 1974 High Street. They supported Queen and Quo in 70s.
State Of Independence	4:25	Donna Summer	Written by Jon Anderson and Vangelis. This version from 1982 album Donna Summer produced a Quincy Jones.
Let's Stay Together	3:19	Al Green	From 1972 album 'Al Green'. It was ranked the 60th greatest song of all time by Rolling Stone magazine on their list of the 500 Greatest Songs of All Time.
Don't Leave Me This Way	3:33	Thelma Houston	Eritten by Kenneth Gamble, Leon Huff and Cary Gilbert. First charting as a hit for Harold Melvin & the Blue Notes in 1975. This was a huge disco hit for Motown artist Thelma Houston in 1977.
Never Can Say Goodbye	2:58	Gloria Gaynor	From her debut 1975 debut album of the same name - one of the earliest Disco abums
I'm Coming Out	3:15	Diana Ross	It was written and produced by Chic members Bernard Edwards and Nile Rodgers, and released in 1980. The lyrics hold an additional meaning to Ross, as she was leaving Motown Records at the time.
The Goodbye Look	4:50	Donald Fagen	From The Nightfly, the first solo album by Steely Dan co-founder Donald Fagen, released in 1982 - Fagen's first release without longtime collaborator Walter Becker.
Should I Stay or Should I Go	3:08	The Clash	From their album 1981 Combat Rock and featured Mick Jones on lead vocals. The Spanish backing vocals were sung by Joe Strummer and Joe Ely
Si Tu Dois Partir	2:20	Fairport Convention	"If You Gotta Go, Go Now", written by Bob Dylan in 1964. Fairport Convention translated the song into French for a single in 1969, and was their only charting single
Ne Me Quitte Pas	3:38	Nina Simone	(Don't leave me) 1959 French song by the Belgian singer-songwriter Jacques Brel. Rod McKuen wrote English lyrics to it and it became "If You Go Away", covered by Glen Campbell, Tom Jones and Dusty Springfield, amongst others. This from 1965.
Stay With Me	3:32	Lorraine Ellison	Recorded in 1966 as a last-minute booking, following a studio cancellation by Frank Sinatra. With a 46-piece orchestra already hired, Ellison was called into the studio to record it live with the orchestra.
Stay With Me	4:40	Faces	Written by Rod Stewart and Ronnie Wood for their 1971 album A Nod Is As Good As a Wink to a Blind Horse. At 69 Ronnie Wood has just become dad to twin girls.
The Intro And The Outro	3:05	Bonzo Dog Doo-Dah Band	Appears on their debut album, Gorilla (1967). Eric Clapton—mentioned in Stanshall's patter as playing the ukulele actually plays the ukulele on this. Val Doonican also appears as himself.
Baby Please Don't Go	5:40	The Amboy Dukes	Band formed in 1964 in Detroit, Michigan, their name comes from the title of a novel by Irving Shulman. A young Ted Nugent was on lead guitar. Earlist version of this was by Big Joe Williams in 1935. This from 1968. Them released a version in 1964.
The "In" Crowd	2:52	Dobie Gray	From his 1964 album Dobie Gray Sings for 'In' Crowders That 'Go Go'. Live version by The Ramsey Lewis Trio in 1965 and also covered by Bryan Ferry on his 1974 album Another Time, Another Place
Out On The Floor	1:59	Dobie Gray	Lawrence Darrow Brown. This was a 1966 recording which would become a British hit in 1975 due to the Northern Soul scene.
Gonna Get Along Without You Now	2:13	The Vibrations	The group initially began recording as The Jay Hawks, and had a hit in 1956 with "Stranded in the Jungle". This from 1966. Viola Wills did a disco version in 1979
Leave Earth	2:32	Derrick Morgan	1961. Morgan had a major success in 1962 with "Forward March", a song celebrating Jamaican independence from Great Britain.
The State I Am In	4:58	Belle & Sebastian	Opening track on 1996 début album, Tigermilk.
Go Now	2:39	Bessie Banks	Composed by Larry Banks and Milton Bennett and first recorded in January 1964 by Bessie Banks, and later became associated with The Moody Blues.
Wish Me Luck As You Wave Me	3:10	Vera Lynn	Made popular during the Second World War by Gracie Fields.
