	Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	Dr. Boogie Presents Heavy Jelly
	Tennessee Plates	2:58	John Hiatt	Slow Turning 1988
	Reason To Believe	4:09	Bruce Springsteen	Nebraska - originally intended as demos of songs to be recorded with the E Street Band. Recorded on a TEAC Portastudio, the world's first four-track recorder based on a standard compact audio cassette tape. 1982.
	Walk Between Raindrops	2:39	Donald Fagen	The Nightfly First solo album by Steely Dan co-founder Donald Fagen, released in 1982. It was an early example of a fully digital recording in popular music.
	Don't Forget About Me	2:53	Dusty Springfield	Dusty In Memphis Her final vocals were actually recorded in New York - she felt insecure about recording in the legendary American Sound Studios in Memphis. 1969.
	Everybody's Got Something to Hide Except Me & My Monkey	2:25	The Beatles	The Beatles - but more commonly known as The White Album Most of the songs on the album were written in 1968 at a Transcendental Meditation course in India. It is the longest title of any song released by them.
	Mrs. Vandebilt	4:42	Paul McCartney & Wings	Band On The Run - Wings 3rd and most successful album, 1973 Opening lines are taken from the catchphrase of English music hall performer Charlie Chester.
	Editions of You	3:53	Roxy Music	For Your Pleasure- 2nd album, 1973 It was their last to feature synthesiser and sound specialist Brian Eno
	Trampled Under Foot	5:36	Led Zeppelin	Physical Graffiti - 1975, double album that includes unreleased tracks from earlier recording sessions: one outtake from Led Zeppelin III; three from Led Zeppelin IV; and three from Houses of the Holy including its unused title track.
	King Of The Mountain	4:54	Kate Bush	Aerial 1 - A Sea of Honey 2005, her first brand new material released since her 1993 album The Red Shoes, it was also her first double album.
	Abattoir Blues	3:59	Nick Cave & The Bad Seeds	Abattoir Blues / The Lyre Of Orpheus Abattoir Blues is the fast and furious record, Lyre the slower - both recorded in only 2 weeks in 2004
	5ive Gears In Reverse	2:39	Elvis Costello	Get Happy!! - 1980, his third with the Attractions, Get Happy!! is, unlike his previous albums, heavily influenced by R&B and soul music.
	Only The Strong Survive	2:45	Elvis Presley	From Elvis In Memphis - recorded at American Sound Studio in Memphis in early 1969 under the direction of producer Chips Moman.
	This Flight Tonight	2:53	Joni Mitchell	Blue - 1971 It tells of the singer's regrets as she leaves her lover on a flight and wishes to return
	Crow & A Baby	3:43	Human League	Travelogue - 1980, their second album
	Raspberry Beret	3:54	Hindu Love Gods	Hindu Love Gods - their only album, released in 1990. Bill Berry, Peter Buck, and Mike Mills of R.E.M. with Warren Zevon. Reputedly made during a late night drunken recording session
	Pulled Up	4:37	Talking Heads	Talking Heads: 77 - debut album
	Cemetery Gates	2:41	The Smiths	The Queen Is Dead - 1986, their 3rd album Ranked the greatest record of all time on NME Greatest Albums of All Time list. Title mis-spelt
	Oh! You Pretty Things	3:12	David Bowie	Hunky Dory - 1971 Piano intro by Rick Wakeman His first release through RCA, which would be his label for the next decade
	All Through The City	3:09	Dr. Feelgood	Down By The Jetty - debut album, released in January 1975.
	Brand New Cadillac	2:08	The Clash	London Calling - 1979 Original by Vince Taylor in 1952
	Caravan	5:01	Van Morrison	Moondance
