Backslop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	songs from the 1980s and 1990s.
Good Golly Miss Molly	2:44	Creedence Clearwater Revival	From Bayou Country, 1969, their second album. First recorded by Little Richard, 1958.
Raspberry Beret	3:54	Hindu Love Gods	Hindu Love Gods - their only album, released in 1990. Bill Berry, Peter Buck, and Mike Mills of R.E.M. with Warren Zevon.
Don't Stop Moving	4:49	The Beautiful South	From Golddiggas, Headnodders and Pholk Songs, the ninth and penultimate album by The Beautiful South, released in 2004 - mostly cover versions. Original by S Club 7 and was number 1 in 2001.
Black Hole Sun (Lounge Version)	4:38	Steve Lawrence and Eydie Gorme	Husband and wife duo who performed since 1950s till Eydie's death in 2013.  Original by Soundgarden, from album Superunknown (1994). It is arguably the band's most recognizable and most popular song.
If I Were A Carpenter	3:48	Bob Seger	Written by Tim Hardin in 1967. Four Tops had a top 20 hit with it in the following year. This was a minor hit in 1970, from Smoking O.P.s album.
Love Hangover	4:24	The Associates	Recorded by Diana Ross in 1975, this from 1982 - double A side with 18 Carat Love Affair
Girls Talk	3:25	Linda Ronstadt	1980, from album Mad Love, debuted at #5 on the Billboard album chart, a record at the time and a first for any female artist. Originally written for Costello's 1979 album Get Happy!!, the song was also recorded by Dave Edmunds.
Getting Mighty Crowded	2:09	Elvis Costello	From his 1980 album Get Happy!!, original by Betty Everett in1965 best known for her biggest hit single, the million-selling "The Shoop Shoop Song (It's in His Kiss)".
Theres a Ghost in My House	2:35	The Fall	Written by Holland, Dozier, Holland for Motown in 1966. This from 1988 album The Frenz Experiment, The Fall's 10th. 7 It was their first single to reach the top 50 in the UK, peaking at no. 3.
It's My Party	2:01	Bryan Ferry	From These Foolish Things, his debut solo album, 1973. Original by Lesley Gore in 1963, which was the first hit single for producer Quincy Jones.
Stand By Your Man	2:45	Lyle Lovett	1989, fom album Lyle Lovett and His Large Band. Co-written by Tammy Wynette and Billy Sherrill in 1975
You Can't Do That	2:20	Harry Nilsson	Original 1964, B-side of Beatles sixth single "Can't Buy Me Love". This from 1967 album Pandemonium Shadow Show, his second. Quotes lyrics from 17 other Beatles songs.
Hey Jude	4:09	Wilson Pickett	Recorded at Fame Studios, Muscle Shoals, Alabama in 1969, with a band that featured guitarist Duane Allman - said to be the beginnings of Southern Rock. Eric Clapton's Favorite Guitar Solo.
Taxman	3:46	Junior Parker	1966, from Revolver album. Parker's version from Love Ain't Nothin' but a Business Goin' On, 1971 - also covering Lady Madonna and Tomorrow Never Knows
Superstar	4:06	Sonic Youth	1969 original by Bonnie and Delaney, but called Groupie. Best-known version is by the Carpenters in 1971. From 1994 tribute album If I Were a Carpenter. Richard Carpenter has expressed his distaste for this version.
Common People	4:41	William Shatner	From Has Been album (2004), produced and arranged by Ben Folds. Features guest appearance from Joe Jackson.
I Predict A Riot	4:42	The Bonzo Dog Doo Dah Band	Original from Kaiser Chiefs debut album Employment, 2004. This from Pour l'Amour Des Chiens (French meaning For the Love of Dogs), a re-union album from 2007. Guest vocals by Adrian Edmondson.
Diamonds in the Mine	3:11	The Broken Family Band	1971, Songs of Love and Hate, third studio album by Canadian singer-songwriter Leonard Cohen. This from their 3rd album, Balls, 2006.
Hounds Of Love	3:03	The Futureheads	Original from 1986, from Hounds of Love - Kate Bush's 5th album. Post-punk band from Sunderland, The Futureheads, covered the song in 2005, scoring a UK top 10 hit with it.
Thinking Of You	3:53	Paul Weller	This from Weller's 2004 covers album Studio 150, named after the small Amsterdam studio in which it was recorded. Written and produced by Nile Rodgers and Bernard Edwards, original was a hit for Sister Sledge in 1984.
Dancing in the Dark	4:19	Ruth Moody	This from the album These Wilder Things (2013), she is a member of the Canadian folk trio The Wailin' Jennys. Original single released from Bruce Springsteen's 1984 album, Born in the USA
(I'm Not) The Wanderer	2:58	Ted Chippington	Francis Smyth; a stand-up comedian born 1962 in Stoke-on-Trent. Claimed that his main reason for retiring from the stage in the 1990s was that he was becoming too popular.
