I Was Made For Lovin' You	4:33	Kiss	From their 1979 album Dynasty. It was the band's second Gold single, selling over 1 million. Co-written by Desmond Child and Vini Poncia, stated that it was a conscious effort on his part to prove how easy it was to write and record a hit disco song.
This Flight Tonight	3:23	Nazareth	Written by Joni Mitchell, from her 1971 album Blue. This from 1973.
Rocky Mountain Way	5:17	Joe Walsh	1973. Released on his first solo album The Smoker You Drink, the Player You Get.
Easy Livin	2:39	Uriah Heep	1972, it was the band's only hit in the United States
Sylvia	3:34	Focus	1973. Guitar/organ instrumental, written by band leader Thijs Van Leer, was the follow up single to Hocus Pocus.
Wishing Well	3:38	Free	1972, from Heartbreaker, their sixth and final studio album. Excluding the 1991 remix of "All Right Now," this was the last of Free's 3 UK Top-10 hits.
Fanfare For The Common Man	2:59	Emerson, Lake & Palmer	From the 1977 Works Volume I album. Adapted by Keith Emerson from Aaron Copland's 1942 composition.
Blowin' Free	5:20	Wishbone Ash	From Argus, named "Album of the Year" in 1972 by Sounds magazine. This song is about Annalena Nordstrom, the Swedish girlfriend of bass player Martin Turner.
Back Street Luv	3:34	Curved Air	No 4 single in 1971. Band members Ian Eyre, Sonja Kristina and Darryl Way.
Question	5:46	The Moody Blues	It was written by guitarist Justin Hayward, who provides lead vocals. Lead track on the 1970 album A Question of Balance and remains their second highest charting song.
Far Far Away	3:38	Slade	Released in 1974 to promote the upcoming film titled Slade in Flame
Can't Get Enough	4:17	Bad Company	Their biggest-hit, from their 1974 self-titled debut album.
Keep On Smilin'	3:57	Wet Willie	From Mobile, Alabama. This was their biggest hit, reaching #10 on the Billboard Charts in 1974.
Black Night	3:29	Deep Purple	1970, and is their highest charting UK single.
Dirty Deeds Done Dirt Cheap	3:52	AC/DC	From 1976 album of the same name, all songs were written by Angus Young, Malcolm Young and Bon Scott. The term "Dirty Deeds Done Dirt Cheap" is an homage to the cartoon Beany and Cecil, which Angus watched as a child.
Iron Man	5:55	Black Sabbath	It is taken from their second studio album, Paranoid, released in 1970. Was the second Black Sabbath single in the US, but it was not released as a single in Britain.
We Will Rock You	2:03	Queen	Written by Brian May for the 1977 album News of the World. Other than the last 30 seconds containing a guitar solo by May, the song is generally set in a cappella form, using only stomping and clapping as a rhythmic beat.
The Four Horsemen	5:41	Aphrodite's Child	1972, from album 666. Formed in 1967, featured Vangelis Papathanassiou (keyboards) and Demis Roussos (bass guitar and vocals).
Hold Your Head Up	3:48	Argent	1972. Argent founded in 1969 by keyboardist Rod Argent, formerly of The Zombies.
